### Who may attend the workshops?

Session A and Session B of Colonial Crafts & Trades Workshop are suitable for children ages 9-12.

### When are the workshops held?

### How much do the workshops cost?

### What does the workshop cost include?

The workshop cost includes museum instruction from 9:00-12:00 and 1:00-4:00, and all supplies and materials. We will have a 15 min. break during each session where your child may eat a snack brought from home.

*Please note: If you are signing your child up for both Session A **AND** Session B, your child may stay at our museum for the intermission from 12:00-1:00. We suggest that your child bring a lunch and a book or project. There will be no instruction during this period; however, we do provide a safe environment for your child to stay in.*

Written requests for refunds (minus a 10% processing fee) will be honored up to one week before the start of camp. After that time, no refunds will be given. Full refunds will be given if the session is cancelled due to under-enrollment.
